Have you ever wondered what wild animals do? Or what Earth looks like from space? Then check out a webcam. These are video cameras. They are put in places that most humans can't reach.

#### Zoo Webcams

The Smithsonian's National Zoo in Washington, D.C., has many webcams. One is for Echo, a cheetah, and her cubs.

Other webcams are for pandas, lions and naked mole-rats.

The San Diego Zoo in California is a very famous zoo. The Ape Cam has orangutans and siamangs. Orangutans have orange or reddish-brown fur. Siamangs have black fur.

The zoo also has nine African elephants. Watch them on the Elephant Cam. There are also webcams for tigers, polar bears and koalas.

# **Aquarium Webcams**

Watch sea creatures in aquarium webcams. You never have to get wet!

The Monterey Bay Aquarium is in California. It has many webcams. One of them shows the aquarium's largest tank. It holds animals like stingrays and green sea turtles.

You can also watch African penguins or sea otters.

The Georgia Aquarium is the largest aquarium in the country. It has American alligators. Check out the Gator Crossing Webcam. See the gators swim around. You might even see an albino alligator. These gators have white skin.

They have other webcams. You can see fish, sea lions and beluga whales.

### Webcams In The Wild

The National Park Service has webcams across the country. Channel Islands National Park is in California.

The park is home to many animals. This includes bald eagles. The park has two bald eagle webcams. They give you a close look at the birds' nests.

You can also watch other webcams. You can see fish swim through kelp. This is a type of seaweed. Or you can watch park rangers as they dive underwater.

## **Space Webcam**

Want to see what's happening in space? Check out NASA's webcam. NASA is the U.S. space agency. It shows you views from inside the International Space Station. The station is called the ISS for short. The ISS is a large spacecraft. It travels around Earth. It is a home where astronauts live. You can sometimes see the astronauts floating around.

Other times, the webcam shows Earth from the ISS. You could see lightning or city lights.
